Even so, 20% of eye care providers report a severe or extreme shortage of optometrists, with many identifying the expansion of training and education pathways as a key solution. Addressing this talent gap requires intentional spotlighting of career opportunities and proactive pipeline-building efforts, especially in underrepresented or underserved regions.
